Magic of roll over into IRA

If a retiree rolls over his or her retirement money into an IRA, he or she defers the tax but loses the 10-year forward averaging privilege. However, there is a way to salvage this permanent loss.

The retiree must establish a separate conduit IRA for the distribution and keep it from mixing with any other IRA accounts. Later, he can roll it into the qualified plan of another employment or, if he sets up a business, his own qualified retirement plan. Through this mechanism he regains the 10-year forward averaging privilege.


