Problem-solvers for consumers

The U.S. Office of Consumer Affairs recommends consumers take the following action when products or services fail to live up to their expectations:

- Identify the problem and what you believe would be a fair settlement, such as a refund, repair or exchange. Have documentation, such as a sales receipt, repair order, warranty or canceled check, available to substantiate your complaint.

• Contact the person who sold you the item or performed the service and calmly state the problem and what action you would like taken. If this person is not helpful, ask for the supervisor or manager. Repeat the complaint. Approximately

88 percent of consumer problems are resolved at this level. • If you are not satisfied with the response, don't give up. If the company operates nationally or the product is a national brand, write a letter to the consumer official of the company. If you cannot identify a consumer official, direct your letter to the company president.

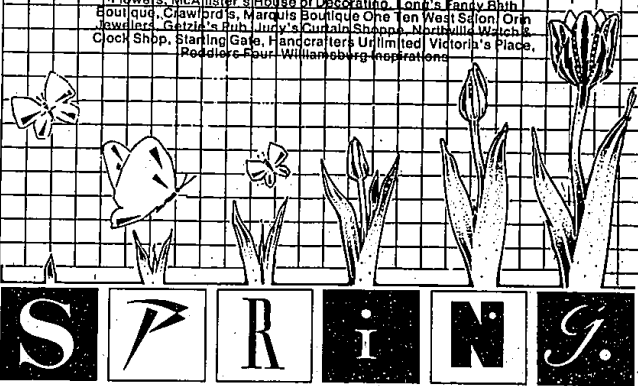
