Hills man dies in fiery wreck

A Farinington Hills resident was one of three men who died when their pickup truck became involved in a fiery crash with a car early Sunday in Macemb County.

The men were headed to a day of ishing in Lake St. Clair. The victims included Edwin Snyder, 67, of Farmington Hills, Chester-field Township Police Chief Henry DeBlouw said. The crash occurred at 3 a.m. on Gratiot at 21 Mile.

Others who died in the burning cab were James A. Edwards, 61, of Pontilac and Joseph F. Coleman, 34, of Ortonville. Another fisherman, James R. Boldry, 34, of Pontilac — riding in a large boat being towed by the pickup — sustained minor injuries, DeBlouw said.
