They may be men or women, working alone or in groups, usually pretending to be someone they are not such as a salesman, repairman

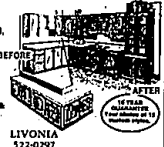

CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS SUMMARY OF PROCEEDINGS SPECIAL CITY COUNCIL MEETING MAY 5, 1986

Mayor Alkateeb opened the special meeting at the Farmington Hills City Council on May 5, 1986 at 7:30 p.m. Members present: Alkateeb, Dolan, Dudley, Marka, Sever, Soronen, and Wolf. Others present: City Manager Cusick, City Clerk Reynolds, and City Attorney Bibeau.

Video Production of Senior Adult Support Services was presented by Department of Special Services.

Mayor proclaimed month of May as "Older Americans Month."

Council introduced Ordinance No. C-18-86, to renew franchise for Consumers Power Company.

Council approved purchase of Computer Software for Parks and Recreation registration programs from RNE Resources in amount not to exceed \$5,064.

Bids were approved for printing of Parks & Recreation Activities Brochure for Grand River Printing of Southfield in amount of \$10,050; City Newsletter for Northwestern Printing of Detroit in amount of \$15,186; and Senior Adult Newsletter for Prime Printing of Farmington Hills in amount of \$4,640.

Council approved additional fencing and related improvements at Harrison High School Ball Field.

Report was presented on Changes in County-wide R-911 System as result of passage of Act 32 of 1986 by Michigan Legislature.

Council approved purchase of additional Central Dispatch Equipment for Police Department from Motorola Communications and Electronics in amount of \$5,172.56.

Amended Mutual Aid Agreement for Fire Emergencies with City of Farmington was approved.

Council reviewed schedule for Mayor's Exchange Day activities.

SAD Resolution No. 1 was adopted, setting proposed watermain district for Richmond Hill and Northbrook Roads, in Westgate Franklin Subdivision (Lots 32-37 and Lot 44); and SAD Resolution No. 2 was adopted, establishing the date for public hearing to proceed as of June 2, 1986.

Council adopted resolution for Major Road Improvement Program regarding millage increase of 1 mill and authorized preparation of appropriate ballot language for special election on September 22, 1986.

Council adopted Notice of Intent to Raise Taxes and established public hearing date of May 21, 1986 on 1986/87 City Budget.

Budgets for Public Services Department were reviewed by Council and additional budgeted study review sessions were scheduled for May 14, 1986 at 7:00 p.m.

Council determined to hold Executive Session immediately following meeting to discuss pending litigation and labor negotiations.

Discussion of City Clerk's letter regarding absentee voter's applications and ballots was placed on agenda for next meeting.

Meeting adjourned at 10:40 p.m.
