Trustees adopted a "stand pat" budget for Oakland Community College — no tuition increase, no tax in-

No one spoke at last week's public hearing, and trusters adopted the blueprint 7-0.

THIS YEAR'S budget, for a fiscal year beginning July 1, will be \$44 million.

Tuition per credit hour will remain at \$26 for in-district students, \$41 for other Michigan residents and \$51 for non-Michiganians. Only minor course fee changes will be made, Nicholson said.

A "modest 1.4 percent increase" in enrollment is forecast, but the proportion of non-residents is expected to rise to a record 15 percent. A total enrollment of 70,200 across four semesters is expected.

"The new budget is increased a modest 4 percent over the current year," Nicholson said. "New educationial programs are not included for the first time in many years.

"However, new ideas are included," the chancellor said, citing \$200,000 more for "staff development" — academese for retraining and upgrading faculty.

PROPERTY TAXES will provide the biggest source of revenue — \$15.9 million, up 6.7 percent due to new construction and valuation increases. Property taxes amount to 36 percent of the total.

Titlen will provide \$14 million, up 6.6 percent. It total, total total, and total total total. State aid is pegged at \$12.4 million, up 6.6 percent. It will bring in 28 percent of the total. Trustees welcomed one small budget increase as having great political significance. Board vice chair Sandra fitter of Waterford Township was alloited \$3,000 for trips to Washington, D.C., where she will chair the joint legislative committee of the American Association of Community College Trustees and the American Association of Community and Junior Colleges.

Jobless rate edges up in March

March jobiess rates in eight of Michigan's 12 major labor-market areas rose slightly along with the state-wide unemployment rate, according to Richard Simmons Jr., director of the Michigan Employment Security Commission. Simmons said normally there is little change in the statewide unemployment rate from February to March.

This year was no exception — Michigan's unadjusted jobless rate rose by 0.3 percent in March to 9.6 percent. Two areas reported declines in their unemployment rates during the month. Benton Harbor's jobless rate edged down from 9.7 percent in February to 9.6 percent. The Flint-area rate fell by more than a full point from 11.4 percent in February to 10.2 percent.


