Halfway House To Open

The "house full of hope" established by a Detroit church for graduates of the Wayne County Child Development Center will officially open its doors on Sunday, Sept. 27.

An open house will be held from 2-5 p.m. to show off the renovating job done by members of the Boulevard United Church of Christ, 12229 Joy.

The 14-bedroom brick house at 2382 East Grand Boulevard will serve as a halfway house for youths after they complete training at the county facility. They will live there while holding jobs in the area.

In an effort to inspire similar direct action, the church congregation bought the house, with the County Board of Commissioners agreeing to pay a married couple to live there as resident advisors.

"We've put in over 1,000 hours of work getting the place into shape," said Mrs. Leona Riebling, church member who originated the idea.

City, county and religious leaders are among those invited to the open house.
