Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police and fire calls received during the past week.

• GAS SMELL
Residents near the 14 Mile and Northwestern Highway intersection who smelled gas late last week have no need for concern, according to local fire officials.

"There's no hazard to the public," said Lt. Peter Baldwin of the Farmington Hills Fire Department.

Michigan Consolidated Gas Co. employees were apparently releasing trapped gas in lines at an area station. They worked in the area on Thursday and Friday, intermittently throughout both days, Baldwin added.

The Farmington Hills Fire Department responded to a "small number of complaints" from residents smelling a gas odor.

West Bloomfield Township firefighters were dispatched to one call Friday morning, a spokesman said.

Michigan Consolidated Gas does this type of maintenance annually, according to officials.

• 2 TICKETED

Two 21-year-old Farmington men were ticketed for alleged possession of marijuana in Mulwood Square, Grand River and Drake, Wednesday night.

The two allegedly were in possession of a joint and a small bag of marijuana, according to a Farmington Hills police report.

• WINDOWS SHOT

Fourteen incidents of car windows being shot out with a pellet or BB gun were reported in Farmington late Thursday or early Friday, according to Farmington Department of Public Safety Commander Peter Amato.

Officers discovered the first incident at 2:10 a.m. Friday. Other damage was found when they checked surrounding city streets. Cars parked on Maple, Chestnut, Cass, Schulte, Slocum, Frederick, Mayfield and Cloverdale reportedly had damage.

Man's body located in pond

Charles Bares, a retired Air Force major and GMC Truck and Coach production superintendent, apparently drowned in a pond next to Twelve Oaks Mall May 3 or 4. He was 69.

"We're not indicating a cause of death until we receive a final report from the medical examiner," Nov. Capt. Richard Faulkner said. "But it appears to be a drowning. The case, however, is not closed."

No signs of foul play were found either during the initial police investigation or during the autopsy, Faulkner said.

Farmington Hills Police issued a teletype message, reporting Bares' disappearance, at 2 p.m. May 3. The police report indicated that Faulkner had been depressed, Farmington Hills Police Sgt. Dennis Rochford said.

Mall security guards found the body floating in the pond about 6:20 a.m. May 5. Shortly before, the car Bares was reported to have been driving was found in the mall's parking lot, about 400 feet away.

Bares retired from GMC Truck and Coach, Pontiac, in 1974. The

Hamtramck native was an Air Force major in World War II and the Korean Conflict. He had earned the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Bares flew 55 missions in the Korean War as a navigator and had been an air-navigator instructor at Randolph Field, Texas.

Bares was president of the Sokol, a Detroit social club. He was a member of the GMC Management Club, the Farmington Elks Lodge and Lodge Pingree No. 366.
