"We're not indicating a cause of death until we receive a final report from the medical examiner," Novi Capt. Hichard Foulkner said. "But it appears to be a drowning. The case, bowever, is not closed." No signs of foul play were found either during the initial police investigation or during the autopsy, Faulkner said.
