The council is slated to meet to discuss the proposed 1988-89 city budget. Traditionally the council meets several times before a budget hearing is held and the budget is adopted.

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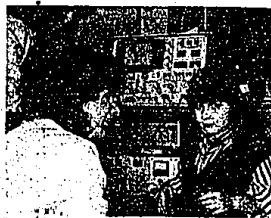
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
