SUMMARY OF PROCEEDINGS REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING MAY 12, 1986

Mayor Alkateeb opened the regular meeting of the Farmington Hills City Council on May 12, 1986 at 7:30 p.m. Members present: Alkateeb, Dolan, Doherty, Marks, Sover and Soronen. Members absent: Wolf. Others present: City Manager Conklic, City Clerk Reynolds, and City Attorney Bibace.

Mayor presented resolutions to Senior Girl Scout Troop No. 1784 for earning the Gold Award, the highest Girl Scout achievement.

Minutes of April 21, 1986 were approved as amended and minutes of April 28, and May 1, 1986 were approved as presented.

Mayor proclaimed week of May 19-24, 1986 as Small Business Week. Council granted variance to Chapter 66.070, Roadway standards of City Code for waiver of necessary requirements for Freedom Hill Apartments, Phase II, Section 28.

Council approved Land Fill Permit for Clifton & Keating, Inc. on Lots 17-21 of Supervisor's Plat No. 11 in Section 19.

Report was presented on Westbrook School Site Park Development and Road Improvements.

Ordinance No. C-19-86, Zoning Request 40-10-85, was enacted to rezone part of Lots 43, 44, 45 and 46 Supervisors Plat No. 13 from RA-3 to RCE in Section 23, Tax ID - part of 23-34-426-031.

Ordinance No. C-19-86, amendment to City Code, was enacted to renew franchise for Consumers Power Company and the summary was approved for publication.

Report was presented on Lavatory Facility Installation for Harrison High School Ballfields.

Council approved letter to be sent by City Clerk re revised policy for Absent Voter Applications.

Approval was granted for On-Premise Liquor License for Foodtruckers of Michigan for 12 month Resort Class License, located at 30769 Twelve Mile Road.

Janet A. Courcy was appointed to the Board of Canvassers for three year term to expire 12/31/89.

Council authorized purchase order for Weed Cutting Services to F. J. LaFollette in amount of \$10,000.

Council authorized purchase order for Loader/Backhoe for DPW to Case Power and Equipment, Inc. in amount of \$18,015.00. Price includes trade-in for present equipment of \$11,500.00.

Council approved employment of Brian McCarthy in DPW, in accordance with Article X, Section 10.01 A of City Charter.

Administration was directed to proceed with work on Bartlett Pond Drainage and report back to Council with cost.

Report on Results of Petitioning Effort for Goldsmith Road paving, Section 32, was adjourned to June 9, 1986.

Council adopted Resolution No. 1, establishing the District for repaving of Bartlett Road in Section 26 and adopted Resolution No. 2, establishing the date of June 16, 1986 for Public Hearing to proceed.

Consideration of Amendment to Farmington Hills Host Ordinance, Section 80.455 (4) of Chapter 80 of City Code, was adjourned until May 27, 1986.

Executive Session was approved following meeting to discuss pending litigation. Meeting adjourned at 10:30 p.m.
