

# Rotarians salute high school leaders

Are high school students being prepared for leadership roles in the world they will inherit?

The answer is a resounding "Yes." If the experience of the planners and conductors of the first Rotary Youth Leadership Awards conference, held at the Novi Hilton Hotel April 26, is any indication.

Over 150 high school leaders, selected by principals and counselors for potentials already shown, came together to hear some outstanding speakers and to become acquainted

with each other.

Students in attendance from the Farmington area: Steff Graft, Matt Gielow, Don Doidge, Pam Guss, Dawn Culbertson and Scott Bissell representing North Farmington and Harrison High Schools. Representing teachers was Duane Lockhart of Lutheran High Northwest.

The one-day conference was under the sponsorship of Rotary International's District 638, and is encouraged throughout the free world where over one million Rotarians

meet weekly in local Rotary clubs. District Governor Arden Deitert of Ferndale was the kickoff speaker. He told his audience about Rotary's founding in 1905 and how current membership strives to keep the word "service" as a major goal.

The preparation of youth for leadership in today's and tomorrow's world is a major impetus within local clubs as well as in the 164 countries and territories in which there are clubs.

Alderman Mary Lee, a Chinese American from Chatham, Ontario, inspired her listeners with the possibilities that await them if they are concerned about their environment

and serving their communities. She told how she combines family life with service to the community in which she lives.

Peter Housheer, a psychologist of Farmington, talked about how to encourage and cultivate communication within the family and in school situations. Developing such skills helps to mold individuals into effective leaders, he said.

John Gross, Sports Reporter for WXYZ-TV (Channel 7), provided several inspirational stories from the lives of great and near-great individuals generally known to his audience.

Janet Guthrie, professional race car

driver, encouraged her listeners to aim high and then accept no compromises. She talked about determination mixed with preparation as necessary ingredients for success.

Henry Johnson, vice president for student services, University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, encouraged the building of friendships across racial and ethnic barriers. Education, he said, is the key to upward mobility for many within our society, though not a total panacea.

He urged students to take the necessary first steps to bridge chasms and benefit from cultural differences within our midst.

Stanley Tulak, a Madison Heights

dentist, was the chairman of the Rotary committee that organized the conference. Students were in attendance from Macomb, Washtenaw, Livingston and Oakland counties in Michigan, and from Kent County in Ontario.
