Pursuant to Public Act No. 5 of 1982, and Public Act No. 43 of 1983, (2nd Ex. Sess.) the School District will hold a Public Hearing on increasing property taxes for operating purposes. The hearing will be held:

The authorized millage rate of the School District is \$7.90 mills. Public Act No. 5 of 1982, would limit the levy to \$5.970 mills. The Board proposes to levy \$7.90 mills, which it is anticipated will result in a 5.36% of increase in operating revenues from the valorem taxes. The Board has the complete authority to establish the number of mills to be levied (\$7.90 mills) from within its authorized millage rate.
