"A MAJOR and significant goal would be to bring together the inter-

A JOINT committee designed to study and develop solutions to traffic problems of common concern was first suggested in April when offi-

irst suggested in April when offi-cials from both communities, includ-ing the Michigan Department of Transportation and Dakand County Road Commission, met to discuss the proposed extension of Northwestern Highway. Although Farmington Hills' pro-posed extension of the state trunk line appears to be a dead issue in light of West Bloomfield's opposi-tion, officials agreed they share many common traffic problems brought on by booming economic growth in both communities.

The proposed 13-member road committee is expected to be comprised of representatives from both communities, as well as from both communities, as well as from the Michigan Department of Transportation, Oakland County Road Commission and the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments.

COSTICK AND Doherty will be joined on the committee by representatives from each community's planning commission, department of public services and planning. A citizen from each community also will be asked to serve. It's expected that Kennoth Poye, president of the West Bloomfield Township-based Gate-

way "PLUS" homeowners organization, will serve as the township citizen representative, Costick said.

A speaker at April's Joint meeting, Poye told officials he hoped his organization could be a part of the proposed road committee.

"We believe working together, we can come up with reasonable solutions to our mutual problems," Poye said.

"WE FEEL some immediate yet rather simple low-cost changes can be accomplished that will reduce congestion 5-10 percent and belp make current conditions more bearable until more extensive cures can be agreed upon by all concerned," Poye said in April.
