

## police/fire calls

Listed are some of the Farmington-area police and fire calls received during the past week:

### 3 ARRESTED

Three Detroit men face felony charges in the alleged theft of two cars from Kendallwood Apartments in Farmington Hills before District Judge Margaret Schaeffer of Farmington, the three stood mute to unlawfully driving away an automobile, punishable upon conviction by up to five years in prison.

Bond was set at \$10,000 for each pending a preliminary examination in 47th District Court.

The three were arrested late Sunday after Farmington Hills Special Patrol Operational Team members watched as the three cruised several apartment complexes along 12 Mile, between Middlebelt and Farmington roads. They then drove into Kendallwood and left in separate cars, two allegedly stolen, SPOT Commander Sgt. Al Haver said.

"It appears they punched the door locks on a 1972 Maverick and a 1979 Cougar, then used blank Ford Motor Co. keys to start the cars," Haver said.

### BOYS REPUBLIC FIRE

A maliciously set fire caused an estimated \$5,000 in damage to a cottage at Boys Republic, 28000 Nine Mile, Friday night, investigators said.

"All accidental causes were eliminated," said Detective Darnel Krause of the Farmington Hills Police Department. "It started in a bed mattress."

Flames were confined to the room where the fire originated. But there was smoke damage throughout the building, Krause said.

The fire was discovered about 8 p.m. by a Boys Republic assistant director. Responding to a fire alarm, he saw smoke coming from an open window in the room next to the fire, Krause said.

### SCHOOL DEFACED

Damage topped \$100 when spray paint was used to deface the rear

walls and driveway at North Farmington High School, 32900 13 Mile, May 31, police said.

An officer on patrol came upon two suspects, both high-school-age girls.

In one of the acts of vandalism, "Prom 88 May 22" was sprayed on the asphalt drive in red, white and yellow paint, according to a Farmington Hills police report.

### RADIO SHACK BURGLARY

More than \$1,000 in electronic equipment was stolen in a June 3 break-in at Radio Shack, 30809 Orchard Lake, according to a Farmington Hills police report.
