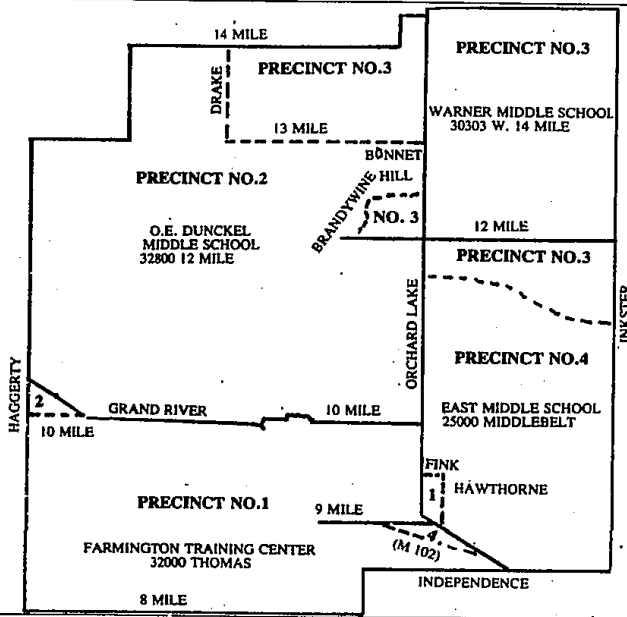


Vote on Monday

The areas shown within the dotted lines on the map at right have been assigned to a new voting precinct for Farmington Public Schools elections only. The new precinct number also is shown. The annual district election is Monday, June 9. Polls will be open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. Two trustees will be elected for four-year terms ending June 30, 1990. The candidates are two-term incumbents R. Jack Inch of Farmington and Janice Rolnick of Farmington Hills and first-time challenger Paul Blizman of Farmington Hills. Nine candidates are running for three positions on the Oakland Community College Board of Trustees. School precinct boundaries were changed this year to more evenly distribute the number of registered voters in the district.

Forums' thrust: paving projects

Public hearings have been scheduled to receive residents' opinions on the estimated costs of paving of portions of both 13 Mile and Drake roads in Farmington Hills.

The hearings are scheduled for 7:30 p.m. Monday, June 16, in council chambers, 31555 11 Mile. Farmington Hills City Council last week established special assessment districts for the two paving projects. Paving is proposed for 13 Mile, from Drake to Halsted roads, and for Drake, from 13 to 14 Mile.

Both projects have been included in the city's proposed 1986-87 budget. If council approves the budget, plans call for beginning construction in late summer and fall.

The total estimated cost of the 13 Mile paving is \$1 million, with the city paying \$600,000. The paving of Drake is estimated at \$750,000, with

the city paying \$638,000. Residents along both roads will help pay the city's share through a special assessment district.

PAVING OF Drake was considered as an alternative plan — in the city's proposed three-year road improvement program — to widening 14 Mile.

Because the length of time expected in securing rights-of-way, for the proposed widening, as well as determining costs to be shared with West Bloomfield Township, 14 Mile most likely will be scheduled for next year.

In addition, city officials believe there is a good chance to secure a Federal Aid to Urban Systems grant to help finance the proposed widening. City Manager William Costick said.
