

# McCarthy Write-In Drive Enters Livonia, Redford

Supporters of Sen. Eugene J. McCarthy will sweep into Livonia and Redford this weekend to launch a write-in campaign to elect McCarthy president.

The two cities are among five picked as pilot targets for the campaign to keep the slim McCarthy hopes alive.

COLLEGE STUDENTS from the University of Michigan and Wayne State University will also enter Oak Park, Birmingham and Ann Arbor in a search for sticker votes for McCarthy. Zolton A. Ferency, former

state Democratic chairman, is believed to be leading the movement. Ferency is on the list of Democratic Party electors that would be expected to vote for Vice President Hubert Humphrey if he carries Michigan, but he is also on the list of electors the McCarthyites will be circulating in Livonia and Redford.

David Managan, chairman of the write-in campaign in the area, says it will be going full blast in two or three weeks. He added it will dovetail with similar campaigns in at least a dozen other states.

One member of the campaign, Robert Clinton of Oak Park, views the campaign as a protest "against the lack of choices provided by the three existing candidates."

MANAGAN describes this weekend's drive as a "trial run" for an upcoming attempt to "personally canvass every Michigan voter before election day."

He also canvassers will distribute write-in stickers and instruct voters on how to cast a write-in ballot. They will also explain McCarthy's position on Vietnam, racism, and poverty in the cities.

The McCarthy write-in committee is assembling a slate of 21 elector candidates to be printed on the stickers, one for each of the 19 Congressional district electors and two at-large.

The goal of workers is to distribute some two million stickers with the names of electors for McCarthy on them for use in the Nov. 5 election.

## Frink Hits McDonald On Money

Democratic challenger Gary R. Frink accuses 19th District Congressman Jack McDonald of voting to cut federal spending in the wrong places and voting in favor of federal spending where it will help his own interests.

In a speech before a Pontiac service club, Frink said last week:

"Can the City of Pontiac afford to have a congressman who saves money by voting against rent supplements?"

"Can the City of Pontiac afford to have a congressman who saves money by voting against the Model Cities Program... and against the Rent Bill... and against federal control over pilot programs in education? Perhaps if our incumbent

congressman were as thrifty in ALL areas, his record would be clearer. But, no.

"WHERE CORPORATIONS, or his own personal interest are concerned, he loosens up on the taxpayers' purse strings."

"Only recently he introduced a bill to allow heavier, wider and longer trucks on interstate highways. Now this bill is one of those hidden funnels down which your tax money pours. Very little is said about them, because they do not involve any great public issues, and they appear harmless on the surface."

"But the Department of Transportation estimates that if this bill is approved, it could require up to \$2.8 billion for

bridge upgrading and highway improvements. Not to mention the added safety hazard which would be posed by having even larger trucks on our highways than at present."

"The trucking interests are in favor of this bill. They don't have to pick up the tab."

"MY OPPONENT'S mailings to this district are another source of needless expense. If you look at the latest one closely, you will find that nowhere except the letterhead do the words '19th District' appear."

"That's because this is a canned mailing put together by a Republican committee and duplicated for general use in many districts."
