The vote came after a public bearing which drew nearly 100 interested "spectators, most of them residents of Independence Commons.
Approximately 100 residents had previously signed a petition against the proposed project and several others had written presonal letters to the commission.

JAMES GINN, attorney for the Beznes Co., developers of the propsed complex, presented a long, detailed description of the plans, including two new-site plans utilizing zoning regulations allowing less density in the area. If the com-lett control to the commission that zoning limiting the bilder to single-family dwellings would not make the project economically feasible for Beznos.

Pringle said the apartment omplex would create a density comprex would create a density approximately 2½ times greater than that of the surrounding areas, which he charged was detrimental to "what we feel is an extremely prestigious area."

IN OTHER ACTION at the Thursday night meeting, the planning commission voted to postpone a decision on a request which would allow apartments between Orchard Lake and Nine Mile Rds. when protests from one area resident indicated that a more thorough land survey was needed.

The public hearing on the township master plan was closed for lack of discussion. The hearing had been postponed from the Sept. 12 planning commission meeting which had failed to reach a quorum.

Two other requests were approved during the meeting: general office zoning on Nine
Mile Rd., and a site plan change
for the proposed Wedgewood
Commons Park.
