Nominations called for 'best campers'

The hunt is on for Michigan's "best camping family" and "best camper club" of 1986, with the winners to be honored at camper shows in Detroit, Grand Rapids, Flint and Port Huron. The call for nominations was issued by Tim DeWitt, executive director of the Michigan Association of Recreational Vehicles and Campgrounds (MARVAC), which sponsors the camper shows.

Michigan's overall winning camper family and club will be honored at the 20th annual Detroit Camper and Travel Trailer Show at Cobo Hall, Oct. 25 to Nov. 2.

All Michigan camping families and clubs are eligible for the trophy awards, and may be nominated by friends, or they may nominate themselves.

Entry blanks may be obtained by writing to MARVAC, Camper Contest, 19045 Farmington Road, Livonia 48152. Deadline for entries is Sept. 1.

In order to be chosen best camper family, the family must be a Michigan camping or RV family with a

minimum of three years camping activity. Nominees will be judged on their family camping activities, participation in collective efforts such as community service, charitable activities, conservation efforts.

Also to be considered will be the number of miles traveled and the number of days the RV unit was used in 1986. Last year's winners are ineligible this year.

The same basic rules apply for the camper club title.

Best Camper Family of 1985 was the Lloyd Schneider family of Chelsea and the club title went to the Wandering Wigwags of Grand Rapids.
