The carillon, installed in the steeple of the Methodist Children's Village Chapel, is a memorial to the late Stanley S. Kresge to honor his generous support for special needs of many organizations over the country, including the society.

Kresge and his wife, Dorothy, visited the village and the chapel on a number of occasions, always inter-
