

Sound of bells marks American first

Christ Church Cranbrook carillon-nour, Beverly Buchanan is keeping a busier than usual schedule these days as the Seventh International Carillon Congress draws closer.

With this, the first Congress on the North American continent just a week away, she and William De Turk, University of Michigan carillon-nour, are attending to all kinds of last-minute details that can make or break such an event.

And when all the recitals and programs are over and the visitors have

been well entertained, most, including Buchanan, will fly to Ottawa for Guild of Carillon-nours, July 10-13. As it turned out, having a committee was a bit unrealistic since the membership represents many different countries.

"We are expecting about 200 and some will be bringing families," she said.

Buchanan is familiar with what goes on at the congress, she attended the ones in Denmark in 1982 and The Netherlands in 1978.

Activity for this one is centered at Christ Church Cranbrook, Kirk in the Hills and the University of Michigan.

The Congress will open with a 7 p.m. Fourth of July recital by De Turk and John Gouwens, Culver Military carillon-nour, at U-M's Burton Tower, followed by three days filled with recitals and programs by the world's outstanding carillon-nours.

Fortunately there will be many benefits for the community at large to enjoy as well.

THE TRANSPORTABLE CARILLON, one of those benefits, has already arrived in the United States from Norway, a carillon is played. The largest bell is 2,000 pounds, so it has a nice tone.

The carillon-nours accompanying this largest traveling carillon are Timothy Hurd, national carillon-nour of New Zealand and the Scandinavian Carillon School faculty, and Sydney Shep, University of Toronto carillon-nour.

Buchanan compared that 2,000 pound bell to the tower carillon. The largest bell at Christ Church Cranbrook is 3 1/2 tons, the largest at the Kirk is seven tons and the big U-M bell weighs in at 12 tons.

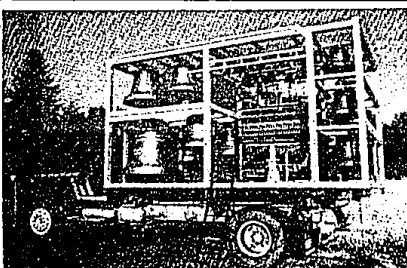
She said many people don't even realize there is a person in the tower playing a carillon, assuming it is all done electronically.

She said of the Congress, "It should be a very interesting event and we are privileged to host it. Australia would like to have the next one."

traditional Scottish works such as "Amazing Grace," Scotland the Brave," "Orange and Blue," plus the Highland Fling.

For those who would like to spend that entire Sunday listening to carillon music, the day will begin with a 9:35 a.m. Carillon Prelude by Beverly Buchanan at Christ Church, continue with an 11:30 a.m. recital at Christ Church by Jacques Lannoy of Douai, France, include the 2:30 p.m. garden concert and the 4 p.m. concert at Cranbrook and wind up with a 5:30 p.m. recital by Frederick

Marriott at Kirk in the Hills and an 8:30 p.m. recital at the Kirk with three Belgium carillon-nours attending the Congress.

One of the highlights for the Congress attendees will be a luncheon that Sunday at Henry Booth's home, Thornlea, and a tour of the Cranbrook grounds.

The public will have another chance to enjoy The Transportable Carillon. It will be at Lutheran Church of the Redeemer, 1800 W. Maple, Birmingham, for a concert at 11 a.m. Sunday, July 6.

Bells ringing

There will be two 30-minute carillon concerts at Kirk in the Hills, W. Long Lake Bloomfield Hills on Sunday, 10 a.m. and noon.

The guest artist will be Alime Lombart, carillon-nour, Belfry of Brugge, Belgium.

A Sunday performance by Danish Carillon School Director Peter Langberg and a special Fourth of July program by Christ Church Cranbrook Carillon-nour Beverly Buchanan mark the first week in the church's 50th carillon season.

The season includes 4 p.m. recitals every Sunday through August. All performances are free to the public who may listen from the church lawn. Programs are in the church narthex.

Langberg will perform his own compositions and works by Milford, Myhre, Scott Joplin, Telemann and

others.

On the Fourth of July, Buchanan's program, which is a tradition in this area, will include "God Bless America," the "Star Spangled Banner" and "You're a Grand Old Flag."

On Sunday, July 6, during the World Carillon Congress, Jacques Lannoy, carillon-nour of Douai, France, will give a recital at Christ Church Cranbrook at 11:30 a.m. and Peter Shepherd, borough carillon-nour of Loughborough, England, will be the guest artist for the 4 p.m. recital.

Dr. Frederick Marriott, Kirk in the Hills organist carillon-nour, will give a recital at the Kirk at 5:30 p.m. Sunday, July 6, and three Belgium carillon-nours, Eddy Marlen, Koen Van Assche and Marc Van Eyck will give a recital at 8:30 p.m. Sunday, July 6, at the Kirk.

Symphony playing new compositions

In a special concert devoted to music by American composers, the Detroit Symphony performs the world premiere of Ellen Taaffe Zwilich's Piano Concerto at 8 p.m. today, at Meadow Brook.

Canadian pianist Marc-Andre Hamelin is the soloist for the new work, which was jointly commissioned by the American Symphony Orchestra League, the Detroit Symphony and Carnegie Hall. The concert also includes music by Roy Harris, Stephen Chatman, Richard Campenelli, and Theodore Dordick.

Zwilich, who won the Pulitzer Prize in 1983 for her Symphony No. 1: Three Movements for Orchestra, has had her works performed in Carnegie Hall, at Lincoln Center and in San Francisco. A violinist before concentrating on composing, she performed for seven years with the American Symphony Orchestra, under the direction of Leopold Stokowski.

ZWILICH DESCRIBES the three-movement piano concerto as "a dramatic work in which the piano is the protagonist," but in which the orchestra and soloist undertake "a joint exploration" of musical ideas and moods.

The Detroit Symphony will also perform the piece on its downtown subscription season in January, as well as in Carnegie Hall on Jan. 30. Hamelin, who makes his Detroit Symphony Orchestra debut at this concert, is the winner of the 1985 Carnegie Hall International American Music Competition.

Three pieces by emerging American composers will also be featured on the program. They are "Crimson Dream," by Stephen Chatman; "Marc Crisium," by Richard Campenelli; and "Other Dreams, Other Dreamers," by Theodore Dordick. These works were chosen from some 13 pieces played by the Detroit Symphony in reading sessions on June 12 and 13, as part of the OLS New Music Project of the American Symphony Orchestra League.

COMPLETING the Thursday evening concert is Roy Harris's Symphony No. 3, which received its premiere in Boston in 1930.

The music of Beethoven is the focus of the Detroit Symphony in a concert at Meadow Brook at 8 p.m. Sunday, as part of the Chrysler Concert Series.

Everybody remembers the shower scene in Alfred Hitchcock's thriller. The usual Hitchcock touches are here, including some shocking surprises and a mordant sense of humor. Anthony Perkins began a long career of playing unbalanced people with his work here as a mother-obsessed killer. This is perhaps more vicious than most of Hitchcock's films and less stylish. But it is the raw energy that makes it so popular. It has been the source book for numerous lesser films. The major flaw is a needless addendum giving psychobabble explanation for what goes on.

depths of MacArthur's arrogance and brilliance are never explored. The style is reminiscent of "Patton" and certainly MacArthur was every bit as interesting a subject as his junior comrade in Europe. But "Patton" was a more courageous film, less reverent and it even dared to be whole.
