Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police and fire calls received during the past week.

● JOGGER ATTACKED

A teen-ager jogging along Nine Mile near Drake early Friday was attacked by a man who had appeared from behind bushes, according to a Farmington Hills police report.

The girl was jogging about 12:45 a.m. when she noticed a suspicious truck driving slowly alongside her, then stop on a side street. A naked man then appeared from behind bushes. He said he wouldn't hurt her, but tried to undress and sexually assault her, according to the report.

When she broke free, he chased her into a nearby apartment complex. When a passing motorist pulled alongside the girl, her assailant disappeared. The attacker's pickup was described as an older model, dark blue truck with an orange stripe and in poor condition, according to the report.

At 7 p.m. Thursday, a male jogger stopped on Metroview near Greenhill Apartments and exposed himself to a woman whose husband chased the jogger into the apartment complex before losing sight of him, said Sgt. Charles Nebus of the Farmington Hills Police Department.

The two incidents took place within a half mile of each other, although

several hours apart.

The men were described as in their 30s with dark hair and similar height and build. But police aren't certain there's a connection, Nebus said.

● BURGLARY NIPPED

Charges in connection with a break-in at Jerry's Shell, 37500 12 Mile, July 7.

Arrested July 5 before District Judge Margaret Schaeffer of Farmington, two 17-year-olds — one from Farmington and one from Farmington Hills — stood mute to single counts of breaking and entering of a business. Conviction would bring a penalty of up to 10 years in prison. Schaeffer set bond at \$1,000 for each defendant pending a preliminary examination in 47th District Court.

Charges are pending against the juvenile — a 16-year-old from Farmington — in Oakland County Probate Court.

The three teens were arrested after Farmington Hills Special Patrol Operational Team members spotted suspicious cars at Jerry's Shell. License plate numbers and followup investigation led officers to a Farmington Hills residence, where the suspects were questioned. Eight-four cartons of cigarettes, believed taken from Jerry's, were recovered from the garage, said Officer David Lee of

the Farmington Hills Police Department.

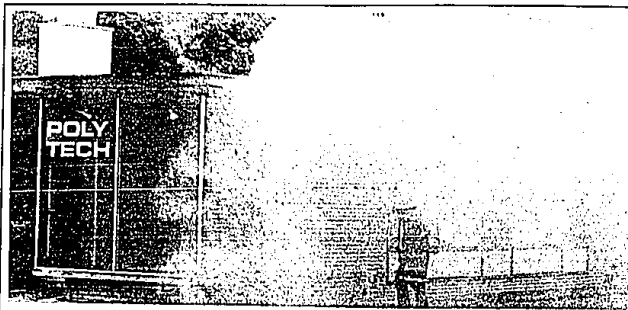

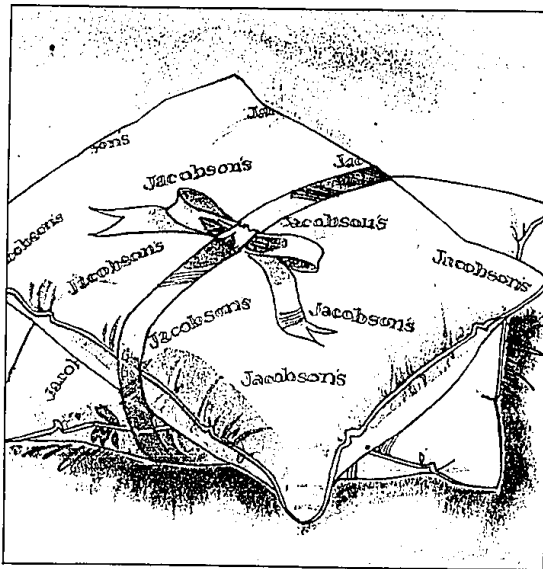
The council is expected to discuss preparation of a master plan for the city hall complex, as well as the ma-
