DISCOUNT TICKETS

A variety of admission tickets at a discount to residents are offered through the Farmington Hills Department of Special Services in co-

operation with the Michigan Recreation and Park Association. Tickets to such attractions as Bobo Island, Cedar Point, Crossroads Village and many more are all available. Tickets are on sale at the City of Farmington Hills' Recreation Division through Sept. 2.

OPEN SWIM

Open swim takes place at North Farmington High School through July 31. Monday to Thursday, from 1-3 p.m. Fee is \$1 per person at the door or you may purchase tickets in advance from the recreation office

(10 tickets for \$8). Cutoffs are not permitted and swimmers whose chin height is less than 38 inches must be accompanied by a parent.

GOLF LESSONS

Session 3, July 28 to Aug. 21, is held on Mondays/Wednesdays and Tuesdays/Thursdays at the Novi Oaks Sports Center. Fee for lessons is \$22 and \$12 for senior citizens.

TIGER TRIP

Travel to Tiger Stadium on Friday, Aug. 8, to see the Tigers take on the Boston Red Sox. Only pre-registration through the recreation office by July 24 will be accepted. Children under 12 years of age must be accompanied by a parent. Buses leave Farmington Hills City Hall at 5:45 p.m. The fee for the excursion is \$15 and include a reserved box seat ticket.

YOUTH SOCCER

Registration for youth soccer kindergarten through grade three is not being accepted through Aug. 6. Par-

ticipants are placed in kindergarten-first grade and second-third grade divisions. Practices are held once a week at the discretion of the volunteer coach. Games are held on Saturday beginning Sept. 6 for five weeks. Fee is \$14 per person which includes a team T-shirt.

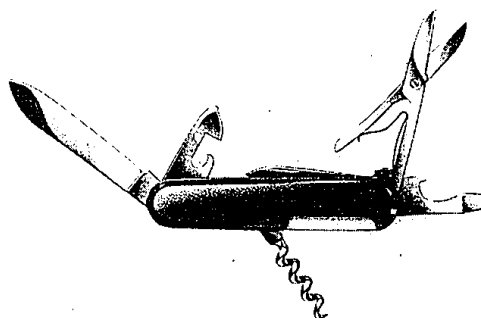
