## Healthier milk produced

A milk with no cholesterol or lactose, fewer calories, longer shelf life and higher calcium levels has been developed by two Wayne State University nutritionists.

Dr. Laura Shelef, professor of nutrition and food science from Bir-

mingham, and Dr. Michael Zemel, associate professor of nutrition and food science from Ann Arbor, have found a way to fortify soy milk with calcium. This has been impossible in the past.

A patent has been applied for by

Wayne State University and the process is being commercialized by Elf Inc. of Lathrup Village. The Elf process makes it possible to produce soy milk with calcium levels 60 percent higher than cow's milk.

The developers say the cost of the calcium fortification is minimal. Zemel said it also makes the soy milk taste less "beany." A yogurt product has been developed from the new milk with qualities which the developers say are superior to cow's milk.

One of the major advantages of the Elf-processed product is that it will bring the benefits of milk to many people who are unable to tolerate lactose.

"This process makes it possible for soy milk to compete with cow's milk for the first time," said Zemel. "Dr. Shelef and I are investigating the additional benefits of this product."

The developers are also evaluating the possible development of such additional products as custard and frozen dessert.

## Drug, alcohol film debuts on Sept. 2

Parents can learn how to recognize the signs of alcohol and drug abuse in children at Brighton Hospital's next community education program at 7 p.m. Tuesday, Sept. 2. The free program is given in the hospital's chapel.

The film, "Sons and Daughters, Drugs and Booze," will be shown to help parents learn about substance abuse problems among young peo-

ple. The film suggests how parents can confront their children who are using alcohol and drugs and points out how parents can prevent these problems from occurring.

After the film, one of the hospital's counselors will answer questions from the audience and explain how alcoholism and drug abuse can be treated.

Brighton Hospital specializes in treating chemical dependency among adults. In response to frequent requests from parents, the hospital devotes one of its monthly community education programs to the problem of youth substance abuse.

"Although this evening's program will be of special interest to parents, anyone who is concerned about the drinking or drug use of a family member or friend will find the session helpful," said Ivan C. Harner, president of Brighton Hospital.
