The long, expensive process to rebuild the roads in and around the proposed Oakland Technological Park in Rochester Hills began Thursday night when the Oakland County Board of Commissioners tentively voted to approve a grant of \$2.5 million for preliminary road engineering.

The grant was proposed by Commissioner Roy Rewold of Rochester and approved by a majority of commissioners. The proposal will be discussed at the meeting the commissions finance committee Sept. 4 and

may be approved by the full commission as early as Sept. 11.
William Fognini, the deputy managing director of the Oakland County Road Commission, who has been appointed by his supervisor, John Grubba, to oversee road construction around and in the park, said that if the grant is approved — and it is considered a mere formality — bids will be let by the end of September and preliminary road construction should begin late next spring.

Fognini said that actual road design — whether roads would be expanded to three, five or six lanes, for example — would come only after a lengthy public review process, which would involve public meetings of area citizens and approval of the municipalities involved.

Fognin said that the major construction would also require a funding source. "I don't know where the funding will come from to construct," he said Friday, "To my knowledge those funds haven't been identified yet. Until Wednesday, we didn't even have any source of funds for the preliminary engineering. That's when we got the call telling us

a proposal would be made (at the commission meeting Thursday)." Fognini previously oversaw the construction of roads at General Mo-

construction of roads at General Mo-tors' Lake Orion project.
He said preliminary engineering would begin with the roads leading into the park. Their widening and re-building will be known as Phase I of the total road project.

Fognini said those roads were: University from Opdyke to Squirrel; Squirrel from M-59 to Bulter: Peath-erstone from Opdyke to Squirrel; Hamilin between Squirrel; Hamilin between Squirrel; and East Hamilin. He said the project would also include a new bridge on Hamilin over the Clinton River.

911 system wins county approval

A 911 emergency phone system thould be a reality in Oakland County by mid-1988, with construction beginning next month, according to Paul Phelps, division manager of the county's emergency medical services. The Oakland County Board of Commissionners unanimously approved the program at its meeting Thursday night.

According to Phelps, the system month.

will take between 18 months and two years to install countywide, at a cost of \$3.5 million. He said the yearly cost of the sys-tem will be approximately \$1.1 mil-lion.

The cost of both installation and operation will be borne by phone users. According to Phelps, a surcharge of 16 cents a month for live years will be added to each bill once the system goes on line with the cost the system goes on line with the cost thereafter pegged at 11 cents a

"THE COUNTY and Michigan Bell have identified 32 separate steps that have to be completed before the system can be switched on, said Phelps. "But this culminates 15 months of effort. I'm really excited." He said computers must be bought and loaded, dispatchers hired and trained, a public information campaign carried out and equipment and electronics installed in 35 different answering centers, which will be manned by local communities.

The system will be for all fire, police and medical emergencies in the

county.

Phelps said that calls will automatically be routed to the correct dispatcher, depending on where the call originates. He said that as soon as the call is answered, the computer will display the caller's phone number and address before the caller even can begin giving the nature of the problem.
