

Resort continues to expand

Status quo is a long way off. A \$17-million expansion is already well underway. It's like watching the evolution of a planned community on a film strip set on "fast forward." Bagley said a third golf course, "will open as early as 1989," the sports complex will be "getting a facelift" and eight outside tennis courts plus a stadium court will be open next summer with an exhibition with either Maria Sharapova or Chris Evert Lloyd as the star. The present outdoor pool will be enclosed and another Redstone designed Olympic size will be built, making four in all.

Nine said his goal was to build, "a total destination sun belt resort in the north. Of course to do that you have to put the type of facilities they have outside in the South inside in the winter and that's expensive."

In winter visitors, in addition to the huge indoor sports complex there are 100 kilometers of cross country ski trails, eight kilometers (5½ miles) underlights, horse-drawn sleigh rides and ice skating on a rink under a permanent tent-like yellow canopy which in warm weather is a picture outdoor pavilion.

YEAR AROUND the indoor sports complex, with its many racquetball and tennis courts, restaurant, pool, whirlpool and sauna, has been active. And after all that activity, indoors or out, the idea is to provide that greatest of luxuries, a beautifully appointed suite and oversize bathroom with equally oversize tub with Jacuzzi. View of the bay or wall-mounted TV, whichever you prefer.

In all of the architectural design, full advantage is taken of the natural beauty of the Northern Michigan setting, through the use of insulated glass walls, door walls, ceilings and atriums.

There are lots of decks, walkways and balconies which encourage guests to move freely and easily from indoors to

outdoors. And the views of the bay, the rolling hills and countryside, and the lush golf courses provide constantly changing treats.

This is as true for the condo residences at Deepwater Pointe, the new Villas and Singletree condos on "The Bear" as it is for the tower and the main resort area.

However, nowhere is the panoramic view of the Grand Traverse area more exciting than from the 10-story enclosed Trillium, a delightful gourmet restaurant and bar atop the 15-story Tower. In the evening there's live entertainment and magnificent views for those who enjoy, romantic moonlit land and bayscapes.

A man who was leaving through the resort's wide front entrance on a bright summer morning as the sunlight sparkled on the dewy grass and beds of marigolds and snapdragons under a sky was dotted with white, puffy clouds, said to his wife and the bellhop pushing the luggage cart, "Oh, that air, you just don't have that down in Ohio." Slowly, silently, they both knew what the parking lot.

It all began when Tom Nino, a broker who was a friend of Nine's offered to loan him the money if he would take over a faltering nine-hole golf course and restaurant and the Sand Trap (still there for hungry golfers). Nine said that from the beginning, they visualized a hotel on the site and had the zoning changed accordingly. For a while it was a Hilton.

Local residents have mixed emotions about the resort. Redstone said he thinks some are threatened by it because of the changes it has brought to their community.

But it is being used by both visitors and permanent residents. Resort people say they've had to turn people away during many weekends this summer. And that, after all, is what it is all about. The whole area looks a lot different than it did say 20 years ago, but then who or what doesn't?

Grand Traverse Resort is now owned by a limited partnership with Nine as president.
