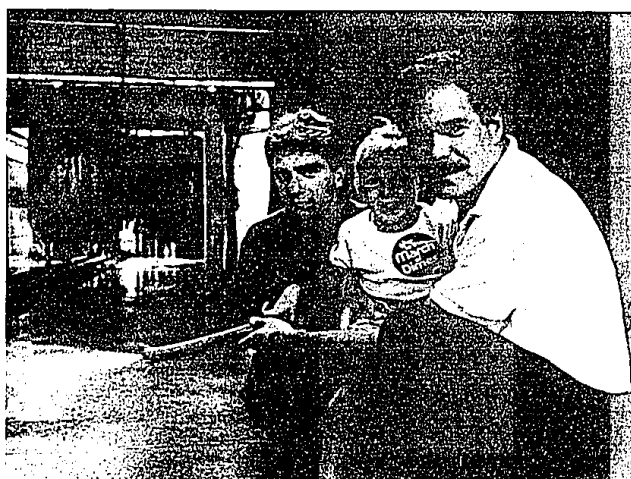

Project HERS under way

Project HERS (Homemaker's Employment Re-Entry System), a program offered by the Women's Resource Center of Schoolcraft College, gives career planning advice and guidance to displaced homemakers.

The program is designed to make entry or re-entry into the work force not only possible, but less traumatic for mature women. Displaced homemakers are women who have worked in the home most of their lives and who have lost their source of income due to death, disability, desertion, divorce or separation from the person on whom they have been dependent.

Financial aid is available to cover the cost of tuition for displaced homemakers, homemakers, single

parents or non-traditional job trainees who lack adequate job skills or recent, skilled, full-time work experience.
