CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS SUMMARY OF PROCEEDINGS REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING AUGUST 25, 1986

Mayor Alkaeeb opened the regular meeting of the Farmington Hills City Council on August 25, 1986 at 7:30 p.m. Members present: Alkaeeb, Dolan, Dudley, Marks, Sever, Sonora, and Wolt. Others present: City Manager Costick, City Clerk Reynolds, Assistant City Manager Call, and City Attorney Biceau.

Minutes of August 1986 were read and approved at next regular meeting. Mayor presented week of September 17-23, 1986 as Constitution Week in Farmington Hills.

Council adopted Resolution No. 5, directing the City Treasurer to collect special assessments in accordance with the Municipal Code for the paving of Westgate Franklin Village Subdivision and adopted Resolution No. 6, Notice of Intent to Amend Zoning.

Council adopted Resolution No. 5, directing the City Treasurer to collect special assessments in accordance with the Municipal Code for the paving of Drake Road, between Thirteen and Fourteen Mile Roads and adopted Resolution No. 6, Notice of Intent to Issue Bonds.

The following Ordinances were enacted by Council:

Ordinance C-37-85, Zoning Request C-86, to rezone property on west side of M-101 between 13th and 14th Mile Roads (Tax I.D. Part of 23-3-76-031 and 034), from RA-1 to RCE.

Ordinance C-38-85, Zoning Request PC 21-5-46, to rezone property on west side of Middlebelt, between Ten and Eleven Mile Roads, (Tax I.D. Part of 23-23-276-034), from RA-1 to RCE.

Ordinance C-39-85, Zoning Request 23-5-85, to rezone property on east side of Middlebelt, between 13th and 14th Mile Roads (Tax I.D. 23-25-101-005 and part of 23-25-101-004), from RA-1 to RCE.

Ordinance C-40-85, Zoning Request 23-5-86, to rezone property on west side of Middlebelt, between Belfast and Eldred (Tax I.D. 23-35-176-017 & 018), from RA-3 to OS-1.

Political sign ordinance was referred to City Attorney for preparation.

Council adopted Resolution consenting to transfer of employment of 6 employees from Enerios, Inc., 23414 Industrial Park Court, Farmington Hills to Westland.

Council approved application of St. Alexander's Church to hold annual Festival on September 19-21, 1986.

New SDR license was issued to Great American Basket Company, at 29194 Birchard Lake Road.

Council referred naming of park, being developed west of Farmington Road and north of Thirteen Mile Road, back to Parks & Recreation Commission for further consideration.

Council directed staff to contact Managers of Mobile Home Parks regarding setting of meetings with residents for home improvement assistance from OLR.

Council referred multi-year sidewalk improvement program back to staff for further study.

Final Preliminary Plat was approved for Windwood Pointe Subdivision in Section 16.

Final Plat approval was granted for Farmington Glens Subdivision No. 1, City Space Park subdivision, a 10 acre lot set aside 25% of escrow amount until such time as Homeowners Association takes control of the property.

Council adopted resolution approving purchase of solid state traffic controls for traffic signals from Carrier and Gable, Inc. at \$4,339 per unit; costs charged from Major Road Fund.

Purchase order was issued to Law Equipment Corporation for purchase of one one-wheel drive vehicle at cost of \$7,833.10.

Purchase order was issued to Red Holman Pontiac/GMC for one 1987 GMC 1 ton pickup truck in amount of \$14,150 for Department of Public Services and \$1,087 for 1 ton pickup truck in amount of \$16,000 for Department of Special Services.

Council rescinded establishment of S.A.D. C-193 and established an alternate method of financing for sanitary sewer along Ten Mile from Inkster Road to Brarill Road.

Date of September 8, 1986 was established for public hearing (Cost hearing) for Traffic Control Order No. SI-96-3826 was adopted, changing the speed limit to 45 m.p.h. on Halsted Road for north and southbound traffic between Eleven and Twelve Mile Roads.

Meeting adjourned at 11:30 p.m.
