

# Guarneri Chamber series opens

Following another summer break, the musical events of the new season will be picking up shortly. The first event by a major series will take place this Friday with the appearance of the Guarneri Quartet at Orchestra Hall.

The Chamber Music Society of Detroit has been offering attractive and exciting programs for the past 42 seasons. Characteristically, it has featured outstanding chamber groups. Quality of musical content and performance can be counted on in this series.

This season, the CMS will summon again some of the finest groups for its 10 programs. These include five top-rank string quartets — the Guarneri, Cleveland, Colorado, Alban Berg and Tokyo.

Pianist Menahem Pressler, who was here twice last season and whose charm is guaranteed to generate warm rapport with the audience, will be here twice — once with the Beaux Arts Trio, which he founded over 30 years ago, and again with the Festival Winds.

Another attraction will be the Stuttgart Chamber Orchestra with its season-old, inspiring conductor, Karl Münchinger. Christopher Parkening, the guitarist of the international fame, a disciple of

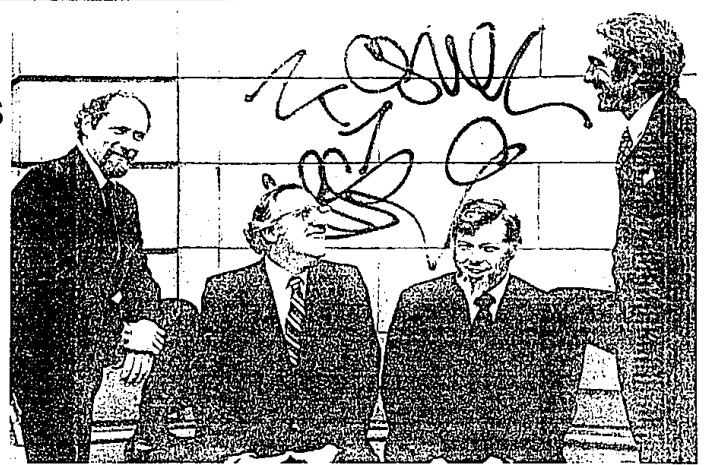
the legendary Andre Segovia, will appear on a separate program.

The Guarneri String Quartet, which will perform tomorrow at Orchestra Hall, has completed 21 seasons. During this span they have acquired worldwide recognition.

Its members, who are seasoned soloists in their own right, consist of violinists Arnold Steinhardt and John Dalley, violist Michael Tree and cellist David Boyer. Their program tomorrow will feature Beethoven's quartet Op.18 No.5, the Quartet No.2 in A minor, Op.35 by Arensky and the Quartet No. 1 in E minor ("From My Life") by Smetana. The two last items are musical gems that are very seldom performed.

Season tickets are still available and can be purchased at 15 percent savings over single ticket prices. Half-season subscription could be purchased at 10 percent savings. Prices of these subscriptions range between \$124 and \$167 for full season or \$68 and \$91 for half season.

It promises to be a rewarding series.
