ONE CARD had a view of the bridge over the Rouge Creek (behind the Baptist Church). It was postmarked Oct., 1914, and was sent to "Mr. and Mrs. Stanley Drake, Farmington, Michigan." In 1914, no other address was needed. It was signed "Catherine" and talked about a dance at the Odd Fellows Hall.

A second card was hand-colored and showed a small waterfall. It was entitled "Greetings from North Farmington, Michigae." (North Farmington was a village at the corner of Farmington Road and 14 Mile years ago.

It had a post office, a creamery, some stores, and a few homes) It was posturanteed in 1910 and addressed to "Mrs. Hess" in Detroit. Sent by "Nellice" it displays a stamp for one cent. For all you folks out there who are younger than 35, post-cards cost just a penny to mall for many years. The message from Nollie discussed the 60 dozen eggs she

that she needed some coffee.


My third card was dated in December 1948 but postmarked in


