Foley called arson-for-profit a serious problem in Detroit. "Overall, it results in insurance companies being defrauded of millions of dollars and results in insurance premiums of others being increased."

Compounding the problem is the visual blight resulting from unrepaired houses that have been torched. "They're atroctous looking," Foley said. "Lots of torched douses go unrepaired, then deterlorate and fail down." Tax rolls also are eroded as a result of arson for profit. "And the schools, the county, the city, police and fire protection, and neighborhood maintenance all suffer as a result." Foley said.




