The Western Lakes Conference football schedule begins in earnest this weekend with several key divisional match-ups highlighting the card.

The Western Division battle between Livonia Franklin and Farmington Harrison could be the biggest. Many coaches believe that the winner of this game could well wind up as the Division champ. Unless upstart Plymouth Canton or Livonia Churchill have something to say.

Last year, Franklin went into the game 0-2, but upset the Hawks in a defensive battle, 9-7. Harrison, however, went on to win the division title.

The Patriots are 0-2 again, but have yielded only two touchdowns. Their defense, however, will be tested by a strong Harrison offense, led by senior quarterback Mark Murray.

GARDEN CITY AT WOODHAVEN: Another Northwest Suburban League opener pits a pair of 1-1 teams. Woodhaven is coming off a 14-7 loss to Riverhead Gabriel Rich. While GC rebounded behind the passing of Todd Frier and Brad Armstrong, who attempted in last week's win over Warren Woods Tower. Picks — McCosky takes GC, but Emons likes the home field advantage for the Warriors.

WAYNE MEMORIAL AT LINCOLN PARK: The Zebras looked both too-called experts last week, blaming Ann Arbor Huron for their second straight win, 10-0. Look for Lewis Davis to become a bigger part of the offense this week to relieve the pressure from tailback Darren Tatum. Lincoln Park (1-1) is coming off a 21-7 win over Monroe. Aggie gridders blanked, 21-0

A fumble on the first play set the tone Saturday night as state-ranked Traverse City St. Francis blanked visiting Redford St. Agatha in a non-league football game, 21-0.

"As bad as we played, our defense gave up only two touchdowns," said Agatha coach John Goddard, whose team is 1-1 overall. "I thought we played well in the first half, but we had no intensity in the second half. I thought we could have played harder."

A botched kickoff return, putting the ball at the Agatha 1-yard line to open the game, resulted in a St. Francis touchdown when Todd McManus recovered a fumble in the end zone (on the first play from scrimmage).

"That just took the edge right out of us," said the Agatha coach. "You can't play a team like that and make mistakes and hope to be a team like that."

"St. Francis has a real solid program. They're starting 17 to 18

seniors. It's a good Class C football team."

The Gladiators' Vince Greenman, who rushed for 82 yards on the night, added an 11-yard TD run in the second quarter and a 17-yard TD run in the second half to finish the scoring.

St. Francis rolled up 240 yards on the ground to Agatha's 97. The Gladiators outgained the Aggies in total offense, 271-153.

Kevin Foulks was Agatha's leading rusher, gaining 64 yards in 18 carries.

Top defensive standouts for the Aggies included Matt Schick, a safety who made one interception, and cornerback Tim Sullivan.

MELVINDALE 21, THURSTON 0: On Friday, the host Cardinals (2-0) got a sterling effort from quarterback Jeff Hess.

He threw touchdown strikes of 26 and 16 yards to receiver Tom Lengyel. Hess also added 74 yards rushing on 11 carries.

Thurston was held without a first down and the Melvindale defense held the Eagles to 11 yards rushing.
