

Polish embroidery is workshop topic

The third in a series of Polish handicraft workshops, sponsored by the Friends of Polish Art, will be held on Saturday, Sept. 27, in the Polish Room on the main floor of Monaghan Hall at Wayne State University, Warren and Third, Detroit.

From 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. Grazyna Kozaczka of Cazenovia College of New York will present a slide-lecture on Polish embroidery, concentrating on embroidery of costumes of various regions.

From 2:30 to 4:30 p.m. she will

demonstrate how to do the embroidery. Participants should bring six-inch embroidery hoops and small scissors. Embroidery floss and material will be provided.

She is the author of many articles and three books on Polish embroidery, has a master's in English from Jagiellonian University in Krakow and is teaching English composition at Cazenovia College in Cazenovia, N.Y.

2 local galleries in Chicago exhibit

Two local galleries, Habitat Galleries of Southfield and Yaw Gallery of Birmingham, are participating in the first Chicago International New Art Forms Exposition, Friday-Monday at Chicago's Navy Pier.

In all, there will be 40 art dealers from Europe and North America showing innovative works of art.

"There will be a strong emphasis on three-dimensional art — electrical art, holograms — things new to the art world," said Ferdinand Hampson, owner of Habitat of Southfield and one of the show jurors.

In the brochure for the Exposition is the statement, "This Exposition has been developed to present art work by leading artists and artists

who are redefining traditional art medias and exploring the new."

It also points out the range of objects is from pure sculpture to contemporary art furniture. Hampson said he is "moving the current gallery show" to the Exposition and will be showing works by the artists most closely associated with the gallery.

The \$75 per person opening night benefit is 5:30-10 p.m. Thursday and hours are noon to 8 p.m. Friday, Saturday and Sunday and noon to 6 p.m. Monday.

Yaw Gallery of Birmingham focuses on functional decorative arts including jewelry, metal sculpture, weavings, ceramics and contemporary furniture as well as pure fine art.

Music school opens

Center for Creative Studies-Institute of Music and Dance has opened a major branch at the International School, 13 Mile and Evergreen, Southfield.

Before its name change, the Institute was the Detroit Community Music School, formed in 1970 through the merger of the Detroit Settlement School and the Detroit Institute of Music Arts. The Institute affiliated with the Center for Creative Studies in 1984.

Courses in dance, music theory and music therapy will be added to the existing programs of Orff,

Suzuki, contemporary group piano, ensembles, voice and private instruction on all instruments.

The faculty includes members of the Detroit Symphony Orchestra and Michigan Opera Theatre orchestra who hold degrees from schools such as Juillard, Eastman, Indiana University, Northwestern and University of Michigan.

Some 1,800 students, from 3 to 80, annually receive instruction at the school. Adjusted fees are available to students exhibiting special talent of financial need.

Nominations open

Nominations are being accepted for the Arts Foundation of Michigan's 1987 Michigan Arts and Patrons Awards. Deadline is Dec. 31.

The awards are given annually to five artists in varying disciplines in recognition of outstanding achievement. Each carries a \$2,500 prize that will be presented at a dinner at Detroit Institute of Arts in May.

The Foundation was established in 1966 and the Michigan Arts Awards began in 1976. Since that time it has honored 57 artists and 30 patrons. The Foundation is funded entirely by corporations, foundations and individuals and has awarded more than \$1.3 million to grant recipients.
