

Central drops Falcons; North, Harrison tumble

Farmington had once-beaten Walled Lake Central "scared" according to Falcon coach Diana Fair in the first half of their girls basketball game Thursday at Farmington.

But scaring and defeating opponents don't always go together. It didn't for Farmington, which lost 64-47 even though the Falcons played their best game of the season.

Pam Fitzgerald's 23 points paced Central. Denise Bolon chipped in 15. Stacy Swanderski netted 17 for Farmington, with Becky Philip adding 12.

JOHN GLENN 67, NORTH 33: North Farmington stayed close to undefeated Westland John Glenn — for a quarter, at least. After that the Rockets took off, outpacing the Raiders 16-3 in the second quarter and 23-10 in the third Thursday at North.

Glenn, which improved to 5-0, led 31-15 at the half and 54-25 after three quarters, thanks to five scorers in double figures: Melissa Smiley (14), Beth Wilson (12), Theresa Telnes and Stacy Graham (11 each) and Jenny Okon (10).

Jenny Basford's 10 points led North, now 1-4. Next highest Raider in scoring was Jean Anzlover with six.

N'VILLE 74, HARRISON 17: Northville scored more points in the opening quarter (19) than the Hawks managed in all four Thursday at Farmington Harrison.

Julie Anger's 17 points was high for the 3-3 Mustangs. Tracey Radke had six points and 12 rebounds for Harrison, now 0-4.

Knipper, Harrison, Orr and Katie Westhoff combined to win the 200 medley relay in a state-qualifying 1:57.81.

Erica Campbell won the diving with 211.5 points.

Lisa Kelly, Cindy Grush, Kalpper and Morton captured the 400 freestyle relay in 3:54.3.
