Self esteem is the key to good relationships

One's self-esteem, or lack of it, affects every relationship one has with another person, according to Diana Kuper who offers three four-part classes on the subject this fall.

"About Men and Women" begins at 7 p.m. Wednesday, Oct. 8 and again at 10 a.m. Friday, Oct. 10. "About Mothers and Daughters" begins at 7 p.m. Thursday, Oct. 9. Both courses are designed for women.

The sessions are given in Regarding Relationships, Suite 243, 31275 Northwestern Highway, Farmington Hills.

"About Men and Women," examines the ways in which women can be honest with themselves in order to share their lives with another. Topics discussed include self-responsibility, self-esteem, vulnerability, autonomy, creating one's own reality, anger, confrontation, forgiveness and knowing if or when to end a relationship.

"About Mothers and Daughters" examines the transition from being a child with a mother to being women together and to being mothers. Topics discussed will be mutual dependency, emotional separation, acceptance, releasing mothers from blame, and friendship between mother and daughter.
