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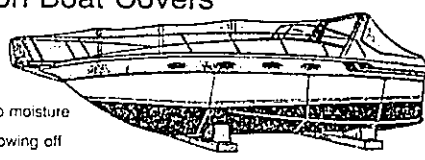

There's always something happening in Downtown and Old Town Traverse City and Autumn is no exception. Happy Apple Days is a tradition which occurs every October, this year from Oct. 2-12. More than 100 stores will be giving away apples during this promotion. It's a great time to shop.

The Pumpkin Patch is a new event planned for Saturday Oct. 25. You'll be able to purchase a pumpkin, have your child's face painted by a local artist, and perhaps win a decorated pumpkin or a pumpkin pie. It's all happening in the heart of Downtown and Old Town Traverse City.

There's a variety of shops to see — men's or women's specialty shops offer a wide range of styles to choose from. Don't forget the kids. There's Old Town Kid Stuff to outfit them and there's Toy Harbor and Games Imported for toys for kids of all ages.

Browse in several bookstores or watch the famous Traverse City fudge being made in Murdick's Fudge. Admire the

architecture, a harmonious blend of old and new. Don't miss the Opera House, the first phase of the restoration is completed. Total restoration is planned to be completed by December 1991, its 100th birthday.
