The fall faliage can be enjoyed from several modes of transportation. Whether your tastes run to flying in airplanes, riding in boats or partaking in more landloving pursuits, the Grand Traverse region promises color tours for all interests.

Airplane tours afford panoramic views of the season's colors and the region's corner of Northern Michigan. Several firms offer chartered air tours throughout the color season. These include Winchester-Frazier Aviation (616) 936-912.

Acme Flying Service (616) 938-1910, and Trans-Air (616) 941-0150. Tours can be arranged for varying lengths and numbers of passengers with coats prorated accordingly.
