Each watch member's objective is to maintain a cooperative system of surveilfance over one another's property. Members are encouraged to call the police and are given an identification number that allows for the reporting person to remain anonymous should they so desire. In this way, any suspicious circumstances, or crime in progress, can then be reported immediately and without besitation.

With the help of conspicuous Neighborhood Watch street signs, these watch areas boldly advertise themselves as residential communities that care about what happens on their block. 
