SUPPORT HOSE

Most instances of ankle and foot swelling are the result of poor veins: blood vessels that have lost their capacity to channel blood from the ankles and feet back to the heart. As a result, the fluid elements of blood leak out of the veins and cause the swelling around the ankle and feet known as edema.

The best treatment is to use elastic hose. This type of stocking compresses the tissues surrounding the incompetent vein, and forces the fluid back into the blood vessel.

Support hose comes in a variety of lengths, from just above the ankle to just below the groin. A wide range of pressures is available, ranging from firm to 35mm of pressure exerted by the stocking against the veins in the leg. Each increase in length or average pressure increases the cost of the stockings.

For most people's requirements, the elastic stocking length needs to be no higher than to below the knee, and the pressure exerted by the stocking should be in the range of 18-25mm.

Elastic stockings should be tried whenever your doctor determines that leg edema is the result of poor veins.
