Winners will receive Sanders candy, flowers from Allied Florists and other gifts.

"We are hoping to receive hundreds of nominations," said John M. Sanders, chairman of the Sweetest Day Committee. "We're looking for those who have touched the lives of

people everywhere and set an example for all of us."
