School Board Upholds 'Rap Line' Location

FARMINGTON School Board members failed to act Monday night on a petition from 5 families in the Twin Valley subdivision requesting another public hearing on the new Rap Line center.

John O'Garra, attorney and spokesman for the group, came before the Board after permission to address trustees was granted earlier in the day. He reiterated objections raised by other residents at previous hearings, including the Center being located too close to the 10 Mile Elementary School, producing undesirable effects on the children there, and creating traffic hazards when those who needed help might drive to the center under the influence of drugs.

BOARD MEMBER Aldo Vagnozzi suggested O'Garra and the petitioners meet with Rev. Ralph Rideout, director of the Farmington Area Advisory Council (FAAC) headquarters, "to allay their fears."

Rev. Rideout told this newspaper Monday that the Oakland County Board of Commissioners presented Rap Line with a check for \$10,000—"enough to fulfill our budget request for the first fiscal year."

O'Garra said he believed Rap Line (FAAC) is a "very good program."

William Prisk, business manager for the Board, explained the Board authorized him at its last regular meeting to go ahead with plans for construction of the Rap Line center. He said a building permit has already been secured from the city.

IN OTHER action a proposal to send a letter of inquiry to residents of Section Six, an area bounded by 13 and 14 Mile Roads and Halstead and Haggerty Rds., was tabled until Oct. 26.

The letter would ask whether they would join in a petition to annex the area, now part of the Walpole Lake School District, to the Farmington School District.

Dr. Roderick Smith, Farmington School Superintendent, said about 15 families would be affected. A new multi-million dollar Sears-Roebuck shopping center is proposed near the area.

John Washburn III, board president, said the matter had not yet been discussed with Walpole Lake Public Schools.

Gary Lichtman, head of the board's curriculum committee,

praised a new "outdoor classroom" idea at Shiawassee Elementary School. He cited a letter from the school principal saying education in the outdoors would "enrich the school's science program by letting children live and work with the materials of science."

THE OUTDOOR class is set for Nov. 22, 23, 24 and 25 at \$13 per child.

The cost of the entire program will be underwritten by a local service club headquarters at the school and by parents of children there, Lichtman said.

About 15 children would study water, wildlife, forestry and geology with two days of classroom training and two days on a field trip at Proud Lake Recreation area accompanied by teachers and parents.

The board also received a letter from the Farmington Clergy Fellowship supporting efforts of the board in bringing sex education into Farmington public schools.

You are leaders in the areas of sex education human relations and drug abuse," the letter said.

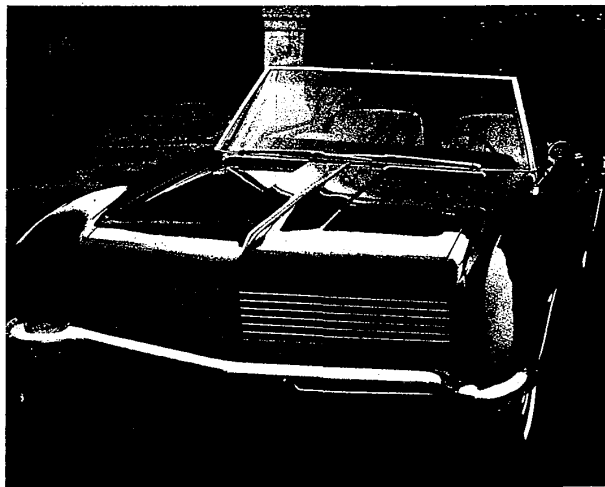

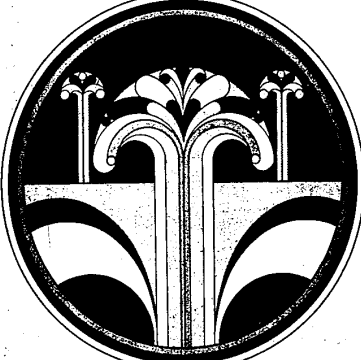
