FIGURES USED in the study are current population, state equalized valuation (SEV) totals and a SEV per capita for the city, township, area proposed to be annexed, expanded city if annexation passes, and the remaining portion of the township.

The total SEV represents the tax base of a municipality. A tax rate (millage) is multiplied against the tax hase to produce that municipality's tax revenue.

Thus, tax base represents a government's ability to produce revenue. The SEV per capita figure represents how much tax base the government has behind each person it must serve.

It must also be pointed out that tax base which now stands behind each south end resident (\$5,150) as part of the entire Farmington Township would decrease by \$750 if the southend became part of the city.
