POLICE SAID they are investigat-ing the possibility that Kennedy may be linked to 24 armed robberies in Westland, Garden City, Livonia, Can-

Westland, Garden City, Livenia, Canon, Farmington Hills, Taylor, Dearborn Heights, Wayne, Ysellanti, Inkster and Am Arbor, and an altempied robbery in Ann Arbor.
Five of the robberies took place in
Westland. The robberies had occurred since Aug. 15. Some businesses experienced multiple stickups,
and an estimated \$6,000 in all was
reported taken, Barthold sald.
In all of the robberies, the robber
never produced a weapon, but
reached into a bag he was carrying,
convincing employees he was




