

# Sukkot celebrated this week

 practiced in the United States have no bearing on whether Sukkot, or any other holiday, is celebrated, Lipszyc added. Many have strayed from the traditions.  
 "We need to bring Jewish people back into the tradition," he said.

"America's not different — that's the theme. No matter what level, that doesn't change the fact you are a Jew."  
 FOR MANY, their traveling religious "tank against assimilation," as they call it, "brings back memories of how it used to be," Lipszyc said. "Some are just caught up in the 20th century."

## Seat belt law is introduced

Farmington Hills has joined Farmington in having its own seat belt law.  
 The Hills council last week introduced an amendment to the uniform traffic code that will provide — as state law does — for mandatory seat belt use in motor vehicles.

"This will allow officers to cite (for seat belt violation) under the ordinance rather than state law," City Manager William Costick said. With a local ordinance, the 47th District Court would be able to keep fines generated from seat belt violation rather than sending the money to the state as is now done, Costick said.

Farmington adopted a similar ordinance Oct. 6. "The fines thereafter would be returned to the local district control unit from which the citation was written. These funds would then be available to help finance the court system," Farmington City Manager Robert Deadman said in a report to council.

Violation of the seat belt law, a civil infraction, carries a \$25 fine.

Assimilation, or intermarriage, of Jewish and non-Jewish people is what the group believes is the biggest danger in the United States today, Lipszyc said. He said it is causing "spiritual decay" among the Jewish community.

Besides moving the mobile Sukkah from place-to-place for 2-hour visits, the group uses its mobile vehicle, or "tank," to go around to meet with all Jewish people and remind them of their spiritual heritage and the need to "keep the Torah (a precious parchment scroll that contains the Five Books of Moses)."

This year, they added the mobile Sukkah to help those who aren't able to celebrate the holiday otherwise. They stress the importance of the Shabbat, the holy or sabbath day, and of the ritual of lighting candles, which signifies bringing light and peace to the house and the world, both men said.

The group also looks to spread the Universal laws to both Jewish and non-Jewish people, Lipszyc said.
