



Students rally at Homecoming '86

FLOATS... AND football... and fun... OH, MY! The Wizard of Oz didn't land in his colorful balloon Saturday at the Farmington High School Homecoming festivities. But he was there in spirit, as students used the Land of Oz as their theme for their 1986 Homecoming celebration.

They didn't need the Wizard to have fun.

"It was the first clear day we had in five years for a Homecoming," said Mike Hayek, teacher and student council advisor for Farmington High. "Everything was just a 101 percent complete success."

The annual festivities began in earnest with a Friday assembly, which some said was the best pep assembly in the school's history.

Student council leaders spent a hectic week planning the assembly and halftime festivities for the football game against North Farmington, according to council President Karen Jenkins.

SATURDAY'S EVENTS began as students followed their own "yellow brick road" through downtown Farmington and back down Shilawsee in the annual Homecoming parade.

"Crush the Raiders" was the sen-

ior cry as they took first place with their float. The house that crushed the Wicked Witch of the East in the Land of Oz instead crushed two North Farmington football players on their winning float.

The junior float, which took second place, was a giant version of Dorothy's dog, Toto. Sophomore and Freshman floats involved football player themes. The band's float was in the shape of a witch's hat.

The only down part of the day was the 24-0 football loss to North Farmington, Hayek said.

The student council-sponsored halftime show peaked things up, as seniors Leslie Martin and Dan Woytowich were crowned Homecoming king and queen for 1986. Their court included seniors Kelly Kolozvary and Mary Kay Orrico, junior Kim Colone and sophomore Amber Ar-luckie. Winners for king and queen were announced at Friday's pep assembly and were crowned during football halftime Saturday.

Freshman Tim Shelton won a special Homecoming drawing prize of limousine use for the evening and dinner for four at Charley's Crab in Troy.

A record number of students attended the Homecoming Dance Saturday at the Farmington High School gymnasium, Jenkins added.
