# Zubel

## Kachadoorian in special 1-man show

New works from the private collection of Zubel Kachadoorian plus earlier Zubel works from local collectors will be on exhibition at the University of Michigan-library from Nov. 7 to Dec. 14.

Fifteen two-dimensional works and five sculptures belonging to the artist will be on display, along with earlier works borrowed from private collections in western Wayne County. This exhibition is a special one-man show of the annual presentation "The Dearborn Collect," a show highlighting major local artists and collectors.

Kachadoorian — working under the name of Zubel — is a multimedia artist who was born in Detroit, lived in Dearborn for 16 years, graduated from Dearborn Fordson High School and also lived in the south of France

for several years. Currently he works out of a studio on Beaubien Street in downtown Detroit.

Zubel received the Prix de Rome in 1984, served as artist in residence at the Art Institute of Chicago and started Project Outreach in Michigan.

One of his major local works is the triptych altar piece in St. John's Armenian Church in Southfield. Additional works are included in the Detroit Institute of Arts, the Tate Gallery in London, Worcester Museum, the William Rockhill Nelson Gallery of Art in Missouri and one of America's leading corporate collections, the Johnson Wax Collection in Wisconsin.

The artist has been described as a Zorba-like Armenian who loves the atmosphere of Detroit's Greektown,

where his studio is located. In 1977, an open house at his studio showcased 500 pieces spanning 24 years that included drawings, paintings and amusing iron sculptures.

An opening night reception, beginning at 7:30 p.m. in the university library, will include an 8 p.m. lecture by the artist. Both are sponsored by the Fine Art Associates and the UMI-D Cultural Events Committee.

Art exhibitions at the U-M library are open to the public free during normal library hours: Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 11 p.m.; Friday, 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.; Saturday, 1-6 p.m. and Sunday, 1-11 p.m.
