# Mortgage firm officers go to court

Three top officers of the Bloomfield Hills-based Diamond Mortgage Corp. and A.J. Obic & Associates face preliminary exam Friday in 48th District Court in connection with charges that they defrauded investors out of more than \$40 million.

The charges follow two months of
investigation into what state althorney General Frank Kelley called
the worst securities fraud case in
the history of Michigan.

Both Diamond Morgage and its
brokerage partner firm A.J. Oblewere declared bankrupt by the state
in August. Neal Sutherland was appointed receiver of the remains of
the companies' assets.

Barton Greenberg, Gary Mitchell

Barton Greenberg, Gary Mitchell and Leslie Lupovich were each

charged with 36 counts of violating the state's securities laws. In addi-tion, Greenberg and Lupovich were charged with two counts each of ob-taining money under false pretenses.
