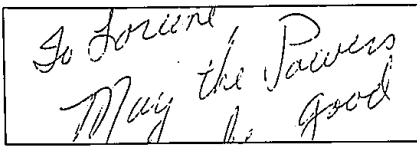


# Little letters show concentration

# Israeli consul general keynoter for Technion

The Consul General of Israel, the Honorable Yosef Yaakov, will be the keynote speaker at the 38th annual dinner of the Detroit Chapter, American Society for Technion.

Scheduled for 6:15 p.m. Thursday, Oct. 30, the dinner will be held at Adat Shalom Synagogue, Farmington Hills.

Stationed in Washington, D.C., Yaakov is minister counselor of the Embassy of Israel.

Born in Shanghai, China, Yaakov is a fourth generation descendant of Jews who came to Shanghai from Iraq in the 19th century. His family, like the noted Kadoori and Sassons families, established the flourishing

Jewish community of China. Subsequently they were able to aid with the absorption of the Jewish German refugees who fled from Germany to Shanghai in the 1930s.

HE ATTENDED British schools and began law studies that were interrupted by the Japanese occupation. Yaakov was a news correspondent for UPI during the Chinese Civil War and a broadcaster at an American radio station in the Far East.

During the War of Independence, he immigrated to Israel, serving more than two years in the army. He entered government service and, in 1958, received a UNESCO fellowship

overseas broadcasting. He visited leading networks in the United States and Europe.

In 1962, he transferred to the Foreign Ministry and served as Consul in New York and later as a member of the Israeli delegation to the UN.

Yaakov also held diplomatic posts in Ottawa and London and has been acting director, Diaspora Affairs Division at Foreign Ministry, and deputy of the North American Affairs Division.

In 1983, he was appointed Consul-General at Washington where he resides with his wife, Arlene, and two children.

Dr. Joseph N. Epel of Southfield is Technion chapter president. Irwin Green of Birmingham is dinner chairman. Epel will host the evening.

AS PART of the dinner program, Technion 2000, a group of young men and women, will report on their recent activities. Cathy Deutschman of Franklin and Lawrence Berry of Birmingham will speak. Both represent families associated with Technion for decades.

Technion 2000 executive committee members include: Gerald Brody of Birmingham, Mark Milgrom of Southfield, Michael Egren of Birmingham, Morton Novick of Farmington Hills, Geoffrey Orley of Birmingham, Richard Resenhaus of Franklin and James Safran of Birmingham.

**SHOULDER WEAR AND TEAR**  
Wear and tear arthritis can occur in the shoulder. When an individual, because of pain in the legs, uses a cane or walker, body weight shifts from the leg to the arm and shoulder.  
The impaired lower limb carries a lesser load. But the shoulder joint, not inherently built to take heavy loads for a prolonged time, undergoes an accelerated aging process. Shoulder cartilage wears down; pain and swelling develop in the shoulder joint.  
In the elderly individual the ability of the upper limb to adjust to an added work load is limited, yet this person is the one most likely to have need for a cane or walker. As a result, shoulder arthritis can appear with unusual speed in this age group.  
In such circumstances, joint aspiration has proved to be the best approach. This procedure relieves pain from the fluid build-up which occurs in the shoulder in response to the continuing strain of weight bearing. How often the individual will require aspiration therapy depends on the individual's need for pain relief and the rapidity with which shoulder fluid re-accumulates.
