CITY OF FARMINGTON COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS (Summary)
A regular meeting of the Farmington City Council was called to order by Mayor Hartsock at 8:00 p.m. on November 3, 1986, in Council Chambers, 23800 Liberty Street, Farmington, Michigan.
PRESENT: Campbell, Hartsock, Tupper, Yoder.
ABSENT: Richardson.
OTHERS PRESENT: City Manager Deadman, Director Billing, Director Lauff, City Attorney Kelly, Acting Clerk Murphy.
Minutes of the previous meetings were approved as written.
Council held a Public Hearing on the Downtown Development Authority Tax Increment Financing Plan, a 2-mill tax on properties in the District, and introduced Ordinance No. C-339-86 to adopt and approve a Development Plan and Tax Increment Financing Plan for the Farmington Downtown Development Authority Area No. 1.
Representatives of Planie & Moran presented the Annual Audit Report for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1986.
Minutes of other boards were received and/or filed.
Council granted permission for the Farmington Area Jaycees to host a Christmas tree lighting ceremony at the Farmington Museum gazebo on December 7, 1986.
Council granted permission for George Ickes to install banners at his new business location, Farmington Vacuum at 33338 Grand River, for a two-week period.
Council established a Public Hearing on November 17, 1986, to receive testimony from the Building Department and the owner of the building at 33300 Thomas Street relative to a dangerous structure.
Council waived the bid process and authorized payment of \$4,500.00 to Detroit Concrete Products for road repair at Shawwassee and Poinciana Streets.
Council authorized the City Manager to resubmit a Michigan Equity Program Grant Application for 1986 funding.
Council established a Public Hearing on November 17, 1986, to receive comment on the city's application for the 1987 Community Development Block Grant Program.
Council approved the appointment of the firm of Keller, Thomas, Schwartz, Dubay & Katz as special labor counsel for the City.
Council approved the Cable Television Emergency Override System.
Council received the final disposition of Pal Joey's, Inc., vs. the City of Farmington.
Council approved an amendment to the current Highway Maintenance Contract for Grand River stating that the City accepts responsibility for snow and ice removal on Grand River Avenue from Gill Road west to the N-102 expressway exit.
Public comments were heard.
Council established a Special Meeting for 5:30 p.m. on Friday, November 7, 1986, to approve the issuance of consolidated tax notes.
Council received the Department of Public Services First Quarterly Report, July 1 thru September 30, 1986.
Monthly bills were approved for payment.
