

## police/fire calls

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police and fire calls received during the past week.

### SHOOTING REPORTED

Officers are investigating a stolen car and shooting incident Nov. 11 that might have been an attempted murder, according to Farmington Department of Public Safety reports.

According to the reports: The incident occurred at the

Huron River Hunting and Fishing Club, 22575 Farmington, shortly after 11:30 p.m. The parking attendant spotted a parked car with its headlights flashing at the south side of the lot and went to investigate. As he approached, witnesses leaving the club heard what they thought were gunshots and spotted a second car with its headlights off leaving the lot.

Three cars, including the second car and the car being investigated by the attendant, then left the lot. The

car from which the alleged shots came, a 1987 Chevrolet Caprice, was stolen from the lot. Detroit police later recovered the car and arrested the suspected thief.

Six-inch bullet holes were found in a 1985 Lincoln Towne Car parked just beyond where the attendant was standing when the alleged shot was heard. "It would appear the culprit driving the stolen vehicle prior to exiting the parking lot... fired one shot in the direction of the witness (attendant)...," one report said.

### SUSPECT IDENTIFIED

A 32-year-old Detroit man is believed to be the man who robbed a clerk of \$65 at the 7-Eleven store at 10 Mile and Middlebelt in Farmington Hills Oct. 20.

The man matches the description of the robber. He is being held in the Wayne County Jail following his arrest after the armed robbery of a

restaurant in Detroit Oct. 29.

### ROOF FIRE

Damage was estimated at \$3,000 when a fan duct caught fire on the roof at Specialty Steel Treating, 20723 Sunnydale, about 5:30 p.m. Nov. 12.

Two roof vents and the surrounding roof covering caught fire as a result of an overloaded batch furnace burning fire and igniting a buildup of dust on the fans, according to a Farmington Hills Fire Department report. Farmington Department of Public Safety officers assisted at the scene.

### DEFECTIVE FURNACE

A malfunction in a furnace caused a fire in a house on Lilac Nov. 13, according to a Farmington Department of Public Safety report.

The resident awoke shortly after 5 a.m. and was choking from smoke coming through the furnace vents. Inspecting the furnace, officers found the filter, motor and electrical wiring burned. Damage was estimated at \$2,000.

### MAN ASSAULTED

Two Whitmore Lake brothers were arrested by Farmington Hills police after they allegedly injured a 25-year-old Redford man following an argument along Eight Mile.

According to a Farmington Hills police report, the Redford man had passed the two brothers at an intersection, and was driving along Eight Mile when they rear-ended his car. Both cars pulled to the side of the

road and an argument followed. One of the brothers allegedly hit the man with a fist and kicked him, causing injury. The second brother allegedly attacked the man with a metal hammer. The brothers then got back in their car and allegedly drove it at the Redford man.

Warrants charging felonious assault are pending.

### SUBJECT FLEES

A man fled from Radio Shack, 33037 Grand River, with two new video recorders valued at \$899 Nov. 10. His getaway with the merchandise from a display counter caused an alarm to sound in the store, according to a Farmington Department of Public Safety report.

Other items on the agenda include: proposed traffic control order amendments for Gill Road and Arundel parking, replacement police patrol and administrative vehicles, the city's tree-trimming contract and appointment to the city's Board of Review.

The council also is expected to adopt an ordinance for the downtown development plan involving tax increment financing. The Department of Public Safety quarterly report, from July through September also is slated for presentation and discussion.

At this meeting Assistant Superintendent Judith White will explain to the board the new staff training system being implemented in the district.

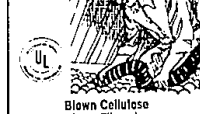

**PROGNOSIS IN ARTHRITIS**  
"How that I have arthritis what have I got to look forward to?"  
Physicians are often vague or evasive in their reply because arthritis is capricious in its duration and variable in its effects.  
Forecasting what will happen in rheumatoid arthritis is almost impossible. At present, no joint examination findings, blood test values, or x-ray results can forecast whether your outcome will be one of recovery or crippling. Nor is any particular occupation associated with a good or poor outcome.  
In osteoarthritis, the expectation is for worsening over time, as each day's use brings more wear on the arthritic knee or hip. But physicians, having seen many instances of individuals who have stabilized despite continued activity, are wary of making a blunt prognosis that a bad outcome is inevitable.  
Your doctor, with reasonable confidence, can discuss the outlook for your arthritis for tomorrow and the coming months. What will happen in future years is best answered by events, not predictions.
