Judges, state elected officials up for raises

The State Officers Compensation Commission is again considering pay raises for state elected officials and a spokeman said the commission wants comments from the public before any decisions are made. The commission will conduct a public hearing at 7 pm. Wendesday in the Law Building Auditorium, Capitol Complex, Lansing.

"This commission is placing a special importance on public input," said Edmund Perkowski, executive assistant to SCCC. Its hearing has been widely advertised. The State Officers Compensation

"They really are representing the will of the people, and if they don't hear from them, it makes it rather difficult to make a decision."

The commission meets every other year and this year will determine salaries for 1987 and 1988. A final decision and recommendation must be sent to the state Legislature by Dec. 31.

WHATEVER SALARY figure the compensation commission decides on for state supreme court justices will determine the salaries of almost all judges in Oakland County and will affect, to some degree, the county and local budgets.

"There's a rippling effect," says Oakland County Commissioner Marilynn Gosling.


